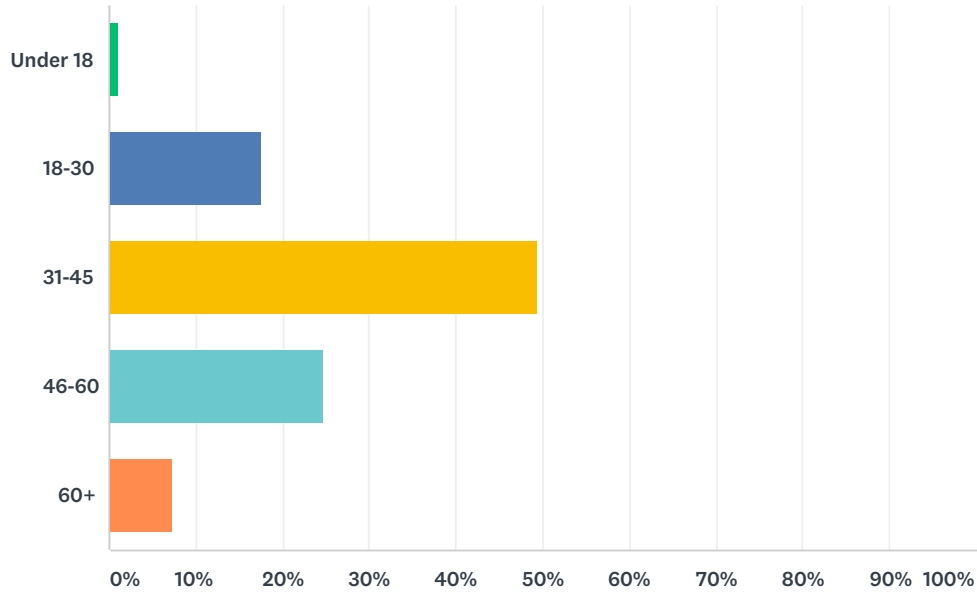


Q18 Which age group do you fall into?

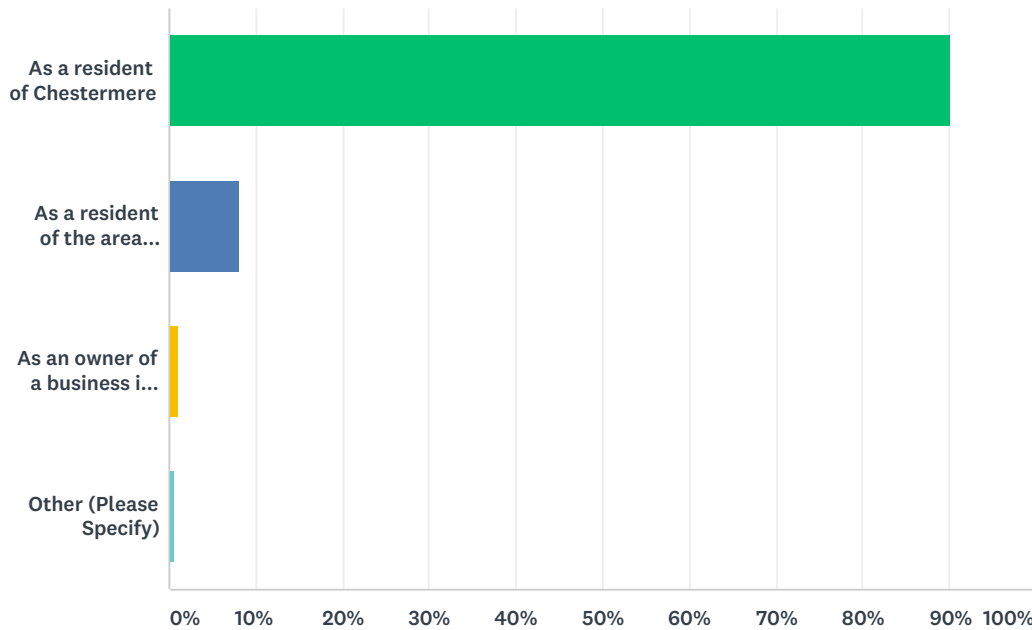
