DIRECTING THE ENUMERATED BUSINESSES TO TEMPORARILY CLOSE**

**(BUSINESS CLOSURE)
DATE OF ORDER: March 18, 2020**

Please read this Order carefully.

Summary: The virus that causes Coronavirus 2019 Disease (“COVID-19”) is easily transmitted, especially in group settings, and it is essential that the spread of the virus be slowed to protect the ability of health care providers to handle the influx of new patients and safeguard public health and safety. Because of the risk of the rapid spread of the virus, and the need to protect all members of the community and the Chestermere area, especially our members most vulnerable to the virus and health care providers, and to enforce appropriate social distancing of at least 2 metres from any other person when they are outside their residence, this Order requires the businesses enumerated in this order to close.

This order begins at 12:01 a.m. on March 19, 2020 and will continue for 4 weeks through 11:59 p.m. on April 16, 2020, unless extended or rescinded by further order.

UNDER THE AUTHORITY OF THE *LOCAL AUTHORITY EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT REGULATION*, ALTA REG. 203/2018 AND THE CHESTERMERE EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT BYLAW NO. 05-11, AS AMENDED, THE CHESTERMERE EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY ORDERS:

1. The following businesses located in the City of Chestermere shall close their premises and cease providing services to the public:
 - a. Massage Services.
 - b. Beauty and Body Services, including but not limited to hair removal, aesthetics and cosmetology, hair cutting, styling, replacement or extensions, shaving, baths, body piercing, tanning, nail services, and tattooing.
 - c. Childcare Services, including but not limited to daycare, childcare/day homes, exempt for children of essential service providers and employees on the following strict conditions:
 - i. The number of children within the childcare facility must be 12 or less;
 - ii. The operators of the childcare facility must have sufficient proof that the parent or guardian of each child is an essential services provider or employee and shall provide such proof at the request the agency;
 - iii. Childcare providers shall remain solely with one group of children; and

- i. The operator of the childcare facility shall immediately notify the agency of a suspected or confirmed case of COVID-19 and the particulars of the child or provider and any persons who may have had exposure to the child or provider within the last 14 days.
 - b. Optometrist Services.
 - c. Audiologist Services; and
 - d. Chiropractic, Physiotherapy, Naturopathic and Acupuncture Services
 2. Any business that contravenes this order may have its Business License suspended or revoked immediately upon notice from the City of Chestermere.
 3. This order shall become effective at 12:01 a.m. on March 19, 2020 and will continue to be in effect until 11:59 p.m. on April 16, 2020, or until it is extended, rescinded, superseded, or amended in writing by the agency.
